DRESS

Players must observe proper dress rules on the course, the practice putting green and practice fairways.

CLUB EVENTS

It is the responsibility of the player to make their own entry as follows:

1. The player shall enter their name on the computerised timesheet and or as required by the starter before playing.
2. The player shall check their name and handicap, also their membership number on score card, due to the scorecard being printed out.
3. The player shall within 15 minutes of the completion of their round place their signed card in the appropriate place provided.

HANDICAPS

All competition players must have an Australian handicap. The Australian handicap Member (Max 36) Visitors (Max 32) will be used in all events. All players breaking the ACR must check with Golfink before commencing a competition round. (Penalty disqualification).

Mixed 4BBB and Mens 4BBB – Maximum Handicap Men 36
Ladies 45 (Members)
Maximum Handicap Men 36
Ladies 45 (Visitors)

In match play competitions the handicaps will be calculated as follows:-

- A. The competitor with the lowest handicap in each match will play from scratch - He will concede strokes to his opponents, calculated at the total difference between his and his opponents handicaps.
- B. A decision must be reached. In the event of a tie after the 18th hole, the match will continue at the first hole. Strokes being taken as in the first round.
The first player or team to win a hole will win the match. (Sudden death play-off).

MAJOR EVENTS

1. Yarrowonga and Border Championships
Stroke 4 Round A, B, C, D Gross & R/Up. All play offs to commence immediately after final round.
2. Junior Championships:
Alex MacKenzie Plate – open to Juniors under 18 years at commencement of Championship.
3. Veterans' Championship:
55 and over. Stroke 4 rounds played in conjunction with the championship. Gross and net.
Senior Veterans: 70 and over.
4. C.M.C. Vagg Shield:
Best total nett score of current handicaps of the Championships.
5. Singles K.O. Trophy:
Current handicap match play.
6. Monthly Medals.
7. Winter and Summer 4B K.O.:
Match Play.
8. Captain's Trophy.
9. Mens & Mixed Foursomes Championship

In all events except 4, 6 and 9 a draw will be made and a time sheet will be published.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. Unless the starter decrees otherwise, all competitors will start from the 1st tee.
Except when there is a publicised draw.
2. There will be no substitution of Partners when a draw for Partners is made.
3. If you enter and qualify in any major event you MUST play the match play rounds on the day and time designated. IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO DO SO, DO NOT ENTER.
4. The Match Committee have the right to change events, dates and time, and trophy payouts where necessary, their decision shall be final.
5. All major events to be played from blue championship marks. Any other tee markers are to be ignored.
6. All 4 ball event entries must be in pairs. Pairs are responsible to find their own replacement.
7. Members may not put a guest on Saturday's time sheet until after 5.00 pm the Friday before.

NOTICES

Machinery in use on the course has priority over players.

The Club shall not be liable for any loss of or injury to the property of any person in or about the premises.

Proposers of new full Members of the Club are expected to play with the Member on their first visit to the Club and to introduce them to the Officers and other Members of the Club. This will greatly assist the new Member to feel that they are welcome.

Unauthorised vehicles are not permitted on the course.

Dogs are not permitted on the golf course or practice fairway.

Unauthorised persons are not to search for golf balls on golf course waterways.

Players are not to retrieve golf balls from the hole by using the head of the putter. Use of the putter head in this manner causes wear and tear to the holes edge.

AVOIDANCE OF SLOW PLAY

1. The player on the lowest handicap in any type of match has the responsibility of ensuring that the etiquette and general conditions of play are strictly observed.

PLAY WITHOUT UNDUE DELAY

2. Players should ensure they play without undue delay and particular attention should be given to time consuming actions such as, marking of cards, not being ready to hit-off, all players converging at one ball instead of proceeding to own ball and time spent at half-way.

LOSS OF POSITION

3. If players fail to keep their place in the field and lose one clear hole, the players following them may exercise their right to go through.

The players at fault must therefore:

- (a) Make up lost ground without delay and split into two pairs, or
- (b) Call those following through.

If they fail to do so, the players following may indicate that they intend to exercise their right to go through.

4. At greens, place you bag to the side nearest the next tee so that the following players may continue as soon as you leave the green. Never leave your bag in front of the greens.

When the play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green. Cards can be marked whilst others are driving.

5. Do not putt out if you have no further interest in the hole.
6. If your ball lodges in a bunker, play your shot and rake smooth all marks you have made and any other.

LOCAL RULES

(To be read in conjunction with the rules of Golf)

BREACH OF LOCAL RULES:
STROKE PLAY – 2 STROKES
MATCH PLAY – LOSS OF HOLE

1. OUT OF BOUNDS

All ground beyond the Club's boundary fence is out of bounds, including Murray 11 and 12 Fairways (left hand side).

2. TREES AND SHRUBS

If a PLANTED tree or shrub under two club lengths in height (determined by the marker), interferes with a player's stance or the area of his/her intended swing, the ball shall be deemed to be interfered with by "Ground Under Repair" and the player MUST take relief as provided in rule 25 (1b).

3. YOUNG EUCALYPTUS TREES – Murray Course

The young eucalyptus trees generally found in the rough on the Murray Course are NOT planted trees. Relief is NOT available under Local Rule No. 2 – TREES AND SHRUBS.

4. SPRINKLER HEADS, SPARE HOLE COVERS AND TAP COVERS

All sprinkler heads, spare hole covers and tap covers, are immovable obstructions and relief from interference by them may be obtained under Rule 24 (2). In addition, if such an obstruction on or within two (2) club lengths of the putting green of a hole being played, intervenes between the ball and the hole, the player may obtain relief, without penalty as follows:

- If the ball lies on the putting green, it may be lifted and placed, not nearer the hole, at the nearest point at which intervention by the obstruction is avoided.
- If the ball lies off the putting green (but not in a hazard) and is within two (2) club lengths of the intervening obstruction, it may be lifted, cleaned and dropped as in Clause (a) above.

5. WHEEL MARKS

Through the green, wheel marks made by a mower, tractor or other motor vehicle may be treated as G.U.R.

6. GARDEN BEDS ARE G.U.R.

If a player's ball lies in a garden bed, the player MUST take relief as provided in Rule 25-1.

7. EMBEDDED STONES

Through the green, solidly embedded stones are G.U.R. Rule 25 applies.

8. STONES IN BUNKERS

Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions Rule 24-1 applies.

9. WASHWAYS IN BUNKERS

Washways in bunkers may be treated as G.U.R. Ball must be dropped in bunker.

10. SLEEPER WALLS ON 3RD HOLE MURRAY COURSE

These walls are an integral part of the course.

11. COURSE RETICULATION

When a fairway sprinkler is operating the area subject directly to the spray is deemed to be G.U.R. Rule 25-1b applies. (Relief may be taken)

When a movable sprinkler is operating, the hose may be shifted provided the sprinkler itself is not moved.

12. TREATED PINE MARKER POSTS

Are on all Par 4 and Par 5 holes.

White top – 150 metres to centre of the green.

Blue top – 200 metres to centre of the green.

13. HAZARD PEGS

Both red and yellow hazard pegs are part of the hazard, however, where a ball lies outside the margin of the hazard and the hazard pegs interfere with the player's stance or swing, the pegs (red or yellow) are to be treated as immovable obstructions. Relief, Rule 24-2.

14. DRAINAGE POINTS IN BUNKERS

The Club has installed exposed drainage points in some bunkers for the purpose of speeding the drainage of water from these bunkers.

Where a player's ball comes to rest on an exposed drainage point in a bunker or where the player's stance is on an exposed drainage point in a bunker the player MUST take relief. The player must DROP his/her ball in the bunker at the nearest point of relief no nearer the hole as per Rule 24-2b (i) & (ii).

15. SLOW PLAY AND LOSS OF POSITION

If players fail to keep their place in the field, they should or may be asked by the Course Marshall to separate into two's until their place in the field is regained. All players at fault must therefore make up lost ground without delay.

16. RELIEF FROM AERATION HOLES, SCARIFIER MARKS AND SLICE MARKS

If a ball comes to rest in an aeration hole, scarifier mark or slice marks the player may without penalty, lift the ball and clean it. Through the green the player shall place the ball as near as possible to where it lay, but not nearer the hole. On the putting green, the player shall place the ball at the nearest spot not nearer the hole, which avoids such situations.

PLAYERS ARE REQUESTED TO LEAVE RAKES IN THE BUNKER'S AFTER USE AND AWAY FROM BUNKER'S EDGE.

COURTESY ON THE COURSE

In the interest of all, players shall play without delay.

No other player should play before the players in front are out of range.

Players searching for a ball should signal the players behind them to pass as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not be easily found. They should not search for 5 minutes before doing so. They should not continue play until the players following them have passed and are out of range.

When play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green.

BEHAVIOUR DURING PLAY

No one should move, talk, and stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.

The player who has the honour should be allowed to play before their opponent or fellow competitor tees their ball.

CARE OF THE COURSE

HOLES IN BUNKERS

Before leaving a bunker, a player should carefully fill up and smooth over all holes and footprints made by them.

RESTORE DIVOTS, REPAIR ALL BALL MARKS AND DAMAGE BY SPIKES

Through the green, players should ensure that any turf cut or displaced by them is replaced at once and pressed down, and that any damage to the putting green made by the ball is carefully repaired. Damage to the putting green caused by golf spikes should be repaired on completion of the hole.

DAMAGE TO GREENS BY FLAGSTICKS, BAGS, ETC.

Players should ensure that when putting down bags or the flagstick, no damage is done to the putting green, and that neither they, nor their caddies, damage the hole by standing close to it, in handling the flagstick or retrieving the ball from the hole. The flagstick should be properly replaced in the hole before the players leave the putting green.

GOLF CARTS

Local notices regulating the movement of golf carts or bikes should be strictly observed. Their use requires approval of the Committee.

DAMAGE THROUGH PRACTICE SWINGS

In taking practice swings, players should avoid causing damage to the course, particularly the tees, by removing divots.

POINTS TO OBSERVE

If in doubt about a ruling, consult a Committee Member – **DO NOT RISK DISQUALIFICATION.**

Time sheets are available for all competitors at least one week in advance, please fill them in neatly and carefully. Members are advised to check the notice board and handicap board for notices and local rules, and to check current handicaps before play or before returning competition cards.

PLAYER SAFETY

There is to be no calling up on Par 3 holes. The only exception is if the Course Marshall instructs players to do so.

GOLF COMPETITIONS AND HOW THEY ARE PLAYED

These notes are only intended to assist in the general concept of how various competitions are played.

STROKE

The score at each hole is entered on the score card, totalled and the player's full handicap deducted. The player who completes the stipulated round in the lowest nett score will be the winner.

PAR

In Par play, the score is entered on the card in the same way as in stroke play, with the exception that where the score exceeds Par for the hole, after allowing the handicap stroke (if the player is in receipt of one), the score need not be written in. When a player is bettered by Par, the ball shall be picked up. This helps speed the game.

After entering the stroke score on the card, the sign for a win (+) and (O) for a half and a (-) for a loss should be entered. At the end of the round, the plus and minus signs are added and the net result written in as so many "ups", "downs" or "all square".

STABLEFORD

The method of playing a Stableford competition is for the player to take strokes at holes as in a Par competition and to score points on the nett result at each hole. At the end of the round, all points are added up and the player with the highest number of points is the winner. In scoring, after allowing for handicaps, a player who Pars, receives 2 points, 1 over Par 1 point, a birdie (or 1 under Par) 3 points, an eagle (or 2 under Par) 4 points and so on.

FOUR BALL BEST BALL

Players play as partners, each taking strokes at holes as in a Par competition. If one of the Partners wins a hole and the other halves it, only the win is counted. If one player halves the hole with a Par and the other loses it, only the half is counted.

FOURSOMES

Two players play as partners and use only one ball. The partners strike off alternately from the tee and thereafter strike the ball alternately during the play of each hole. Scoring is done as for a stroke round and the total is subject to a handicap.

MIXED FOURSOMES

Mixed foursomes are played in the same manner as foursomes except that the ladies use their own tees and observe their own local rules when it is their turn to play.

AMERICAN FOURSOMES (Pinehurst)

Both players play tee shots at each hole, then play a second stroke with their partner's ball. One ball is then selected and play proceeds as a foursomes with the owner of the ball selected playing the third shot.

AMBROSE

1. Team to select Captain (preferably lowest marker), who shall be responsible for the method of play and marking of the card. Cards to be countersigned by another member of the team.
2. Captain to decide the order of play and the same order is to be maintained throughout the event. All players hit off tee. Captain then decides from which position the next stroke will be played.
3. Other team members lift their ball and PLACE within 15cm either side of the selected spot, no nearer the hole, and hit their next stroke from this position, no matter where their previous stroke finished. 15cm applies in rough and hazard.
4. If preferred lies are in force, the preferred lie is taken first, then markers are placed 15cm each side of the ball.
5. On the putting green the same order applies after the Captain makes the selection. All other balls are putted from within 15cm of the selected spot. Players may PUTT OUT. It is not necessary to putt if score cannot be bettered.

CANADIAN

Both players hit off the tee, then choose the best ball and hit alternate shots. The handicapping and scoring methods are identical with other Foursome events.

This competition can be played as mixed, men or ladies events. Lowest score is the winner.

IRISH FOUR BALL

First 6 holes (1 – 6)

– Record only THE BEST score on each hole.

Second 6 holes (7 – 12)

– Record the TWO BEST scores on each hole.

Last 6 holes (13 – 18)

– Record the THREE BEST scores on each hole.

HANDICAPS FOR VARIOUS EVENTS

1. INDIVIDUAL

Stroke, Par and Stableford – full stroke handicap.

Match play – difference of stroke handicaps.

2. FOURSOMES (including Mixed)

1/2 aggregate stroke handicaps.

3. PINEHURST

3/8 aggregate stroke handicaps.

4. FOUR BALL MATCH PLAY

Lowest marker in the match plays off scratch. The other players play off the difference between the lowest marker's handicap and their own.

5. AMBROSE HANDICAP ALLOWANCE

2 players 1/4 of aggregate stroke handicap

3 players 1/6 of aggregate stroke handicap

4 players 1/8 of aggregate stroke handicap.

HANDICAP GRADINGS (Approx)

A and B: A 0-15, B 16-32

COUNTBACKS

The best score for the last nine holes shall be used. If there is still a tie, the last six holes shall be used and, if still tied, the last three holes shall be used. If a tie still persists, then hole by hole scores shall be taken from the 18th hole.

27, 36, 54 and 72 HOLE EVENTS

The last 18 holes shall be used and if still tied, the countback as in 18 hole events shall be used.

NOTE: The best score for the last six holes shall be used in nine hole events, then the last three and, if a tie persists, then hole by hole from the 9th.

Medal of Medallists Final – sudden death play off.

PROTESTS

Any protest in connection with a competition or match shall be delivered in writing to a member of the Committee after the match or competition is completed. Such protest shall be dealt with by the Committee as early as possible.

AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP

The Australian system has been designed to achieve uniformity in handicapping throughout Australia.

A player shall have one Australian handicap only and this shall be allotted by his Home Club. Members shall report to their Home Club all scores returned at other clubs and, with these reported scores, they shall also give the course rating of the day and the Par on the course.

The maximum Australian handicap is 36. All handicaps shall be examined at the beginning of the year, at which time all scores more than a year old shall be disregarded as being no longer valid. For a player to retain an Australian handicap, he should have at that time at least five (5) live scores.

During 2010 a new system of calculating handicaps will be introduced. A player's exact Australian Handicap will be calculated by averaging the best 10 scores within a rolling sample of his previous 20 scores.

Each gross score will be converted to a handicap differential (gross score less the men's course rating). The 10 best handicap differentials will be added and divided by 10, then rounded up if necessary to give the player's exact handicap (e.g. 23.6 will become 24).

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR KNOCKOUTS

(Captain's Trophy, Summer Cup, Singles Knockout, Winter Cup)

The competition shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf, as adopted by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrew's Scotland, together with such local rules as are in force on the course over which the competition takes place. If a dispute arises on any point, it shall be decided by the committee in charge of the competition whose decision shall be final. Provided however, that the committee, if in doubt, shall have the right to refer any such dispute to the Council of the Victorian Golf Association, whose decision shall be final.

Qualifying scorecards to be marked with "yes" or "no" to indicate a desire to qualify for match play.

All matches are to be played from the blue markers.

All matches are to be played on the dates as decided by the match committee and as stated in the syllabus.

Changes to date/rounds are at the Captain's discretion, but all matches must be played prior to the next round.

PLEASE AVOID SLOW PLAY

If there is a full clear fairway in front of you, your group is too slow – these hints will help. Don't delay at your tee if those in front of you are out of range. **HIT FIRST AND MARK CARD LATER!** Go to your own ball first – be ready to play without delay when it comes to your turn. Watch your ball until it comes to rest. Mark it with some object. Clean your ball regularly during the game. Leave the green as soon as hole has been played. **MARK CARD LATER!**

These conditions of play are in summary form. The “Conditions of Play” document in the Lady Members’ room contains full details.

- 1 WEDNESDAY – SATURDAY – SUNDAY:** 18 holes, unless otherwise stated. Names on time sheet at Pro Shop.
- 2 CANCELLATIONS:** Cancellations must be rung through to the Pro Shop.
- 3 HANDICAPS:** All scores returned in 9 to 18 hole single stroke play including Par and Stableford competition rounds, played from ladies tees, under the Rules of Golf must be used for handicapping purposes. Some four ball scores may be handicapped under specific circumstances.
- 4 COUNTBACKS:** For handicap events, the best score for the last 9 holes will be used; if there is still a tie, the last 6 holes, or if a tie still remains, the last 3 holes. If still tied, then hole by hole from the 18th.
- 5 COMPETITIONS: WEDNESDAYS AND WEEKENDS:** If there are less than 10 players there will be no competition. Major events and Medal Rounds must have a minimum of 20 players. MEDAL ROUNDS: A & B – one medal; C & D – one medal. When two courses are played, there will be two separate competitions.
- 6 VISITORS:** On payment of green fees plus the necessary competition fee, a lady visitor holding a current handicap may play in a competition field. She will not be eligible to play in any major event and will not be eligible to win a medal or pewter. Visitors may however, play in the daily competition on days when major events are scheduled.
- 7 COMPETITION RULES:** A player must pay her competition fee, on each occasion before playing. Cards must be posted in the competition box in the Lady Members’ room within 15 minutes of completion of her round. The cards must show handicap, membership number and be correctly signed.

- 8 **HANDICAP ALLOWANCES:** Single Match Play – full handicap difference; Foursomes – ½ combined handicap. Foursomes Match play – full difference between half the aggregate handicaps of each pair. Stableford, Par and 4BBB – full handicap difference. Pinehurst – 3/8 combined handicap.
- 9 **PRESENTATION DAYS:** To be held on specified Wednesdays for the presentation of Medals etc.
- 10 **TROPHY VOUCHERS:** Must be used within 3 Months of date of issue.
- 11 **MATCH COMMITTEE:** The Match Committee has the right to change events, dates and times when necessary.
- 12 In accordance with health and safety legislation, the committee reserves the right to reschedule or alter events where the temperature is excessive, or for any other reason related to the health or safety of players.
- 13 Any protest in connection with a competition or match shall be delivered in writing to a member of the Match Committee within 24 hours. The Match Committee shall deal with such protests as early as possible.
- 14 **HANDICAPPING:** During 2010 a new system of calculating handicaps will be introduced. A player's exact Australian Handicap will be calculated by averaging the best 10 scores within a rolling sample of her previous 20 scores.

Each gross score will be converted to a handicap differential (gross score less the women's course rating). The 10 best handicap differentials will be added and divided by 10, then rounded up if necessary to give the player's exact handicap (e.g. 23.6 will become 24).

MAJOR EVENTS

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS AND OTHER MAJOR EVENTS:

Open to players who are full members of Yarrawonga & Border Golf Club (irrespective of their home Club) provided they have paid their appropriate affiliation fees.

CHAMPIONSHIP: Stroke – 3 rounds (18 holes). A,B,C,D Grades. No late entries accepted.

- Gross Winner and Runner up for each Grade. In the event of a tie there will be a play off (to commence at the completion of the final round) over three holes, then sudden death.
- Nett Winner and Runner up for each Grade. Handicap as at first day of play. In the event of a tie, countback conditions apply.
- Palframan Trophy. Nett Winner. Handicap current on each day of play. In the event of a tie, countback conditions apply.
- Veterans and Super Veterans Trophies. Gross and Nett Winners. Handicap current on each day of play. In the event of a tie, countback conditions apply.

FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP: Stroke - 27 hole gross and nett. No late entries accepted. Play off for the Championship (Scratch) over 3 holes, then sudden death. Play off to commence at the completion of play. Countback conditions to apply for tied nett event.

4 May

MONTHLY MEDALS: Two medals – A & B; C & D - one on each course (Murray and Lake). In the event of a tie there will be a play off over 18 holes. If a tie remains, there will be further play offs over three holes until a result is reached.

PEWTERS: Played in conjunction with every medal round; one for each grade. Valid for 30 days from date of issue – not transferrable.

MEDAL OF MEDALLISTS: All medal winners to play off at the end of the season.

P.G.A.: The best 16 nett scores (stroke play) qualify for Match Play. To be played on specified days.

9 March, 23 March, 30 March, 27 April, 29 June

WILKINSON TROPHY: Select Partners. The best 16 pairs (4BBB Stableford) to qualify for Four Ball Stableford Match Play. To be played on specified days. Donated by Mrs Audrey Wilkinson.

6 July, 13 July, 27 July, 10 August, 17 August

SUMMER CUP: Select Partners. The best 16 pairs (Foursomes Stroke) to qualify for Foursomes Match Play. To be played on specified days.

26 October, 2 November, 9 November, 23 November, 30 November

DORIS CHAMBERS CUP: WGV Competition. 18 holes of Foursomes Stableford. Winners may represent Y&BGC in Melbourne. \$5 entry fee per pair extra to the daily competition fee. In the event of a tie, countback conditions apply.

15 June

MONA MacLEOD BROOCH: WGV Competition. Best nett scores over 2 rounds (36 holes) to be forwarded to WGV. Silver and Bronze Divisions. The best nett score in each Division wins. Players must have entered the Silver Spoon event to be eligible.

2 March, 8 June

SILVER SPOON: Four stroke or Stableford rounds: Players may enter on any day played. Winners plus ties of qualifying rounds play off. Winner of the play off is eligible to represent Y&BGC in Melbourne. \$3 entry fee covers all rounds.

16 February, 2 March, 9 March, 13 April, 20 April

NORTH EAST BROOCH: Best nett score forwarded to NEDLGA. Must be played during the Month of June. All clubs compete and best score wins a brooch. \$2 extra to the daily competition fee.

1 June

DROOP TROPHY: Played on a points system over 3 rounds – stroke, Stableford and Par. Donated by Mr & Mrs Phillip and Karen Droop.

16 February, 16 March, 13 April

GRANDMOTHER'S TROPHIES: Best nett score on each course. Grandmothers eligible to enter. Donated by Mrs Joy Neal (Lake) and Mrs Barbara Smale (Murray).

9 March

THE PRESIDENT'S TROPHY: Aggregate of best four nett scores of Medal rounds between March and September. Current handicap for each round. Ties shall stand.

PUTTING TROPHY: Lowest aggregate number of putts over four Medal rounds (March to September). There will be a play off in the event of a tie. Donated by Mrs Pam Barker.

HANDICAPPER'S TROPHY: Largest reduction in handicap over 20 rounds of 18 hole competition between the specified date in September one year and the specified date in September the following year, excluding ball competitions run by Pro Shop during summer. Ties shall stand.

GOBBLER TROPHY: Highest aggregate number of gobblers between the specified dates in September one year and September the following year, excluding ball competitions run by Pro Shop during summer. Conducted over single 18 hole events. There will be a play off in the event of a tie. Donated by Mrs Pam Charles.

BIRDIE TROPHIES: Highest aggregate number of birdies between the specified dates in September one year and September the following year, excluding ball competitions run by Pro Shop during summer. Conducted over single 18 hole events. A and B grades. Ties shall stand. Donated by Mrs Cherry Gorman and Mrs Kaye Reeves.

ECLECTIC TROPHIES: The lowest aggregate of the best score on each hole between the specified dates in September one year and September the following year, excluding ball competitions run by Pro Shop during summer. Conducted over single 18 hole events. Murray and Lake course, gross and nett, A and B Grades.

BEST ANNUAL SCORE: The best scores on the Murray and on the Lake courses in stroke, Par and Stableford, between the specified dates in September one year and September the following year, excluding ball competitions run by Pro Shop during summer. Ties shall stand.

ETIQUETTE OF GOLF

1. Players should not move, talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is about to make a stroke.
2. Players should not play until the players in front are out of range.
3. When the result of a hole has been determined, players should immediately leave the putting green. Players should not mark score cards whilst on the putting green, nor should teeing off be delayed by so doing.
4. All buggies/carts should be left out of the way of oncoming players. When on or near the putting green, buggies/carts should be left as close as possible to the next teeing ground to enable quick movement off the green towards the next tee.
5. Players searching for a ball should signal the players in the group behind to play through as soon as it is apparent that the ball may not easily be found. They should NOT search for five minutes before doing so. Having given such a signal, they must not continue to play until these players have passed and are out of range.
6. Before leaving a bunker, players should carefully fill up holes made by them, preferably using a rake. A player must not walk up the face of a bunker.
7. Players should at all times play without undue delay. Slow players having a full fairway clear ahead, must call the following players through.
8. The lowest marker in any match is Captain and is responsible for the conduct of her group.
