Hi, my name is Judy Langford and I am an applicant for a Director's position on the Board at YMGCR. For those of you who don't know me, or just know me as a golfer, I would like to tell you more about myself.

I grew up in Cobram but moved to Melbourne to work as a Lab Technician for eight years at CSL. I left there to become a Division 1 Registered Nurse. I started out in oncology. Working in the chemo unit and inpatient ward then shifted into clinical trials as a senior research nurse. After this I moved into rehabilitation nursing and worked casually as consultant for a health care company.
